Best Visit – Oct–Mar (mild); Apr&Sept for lower crowds



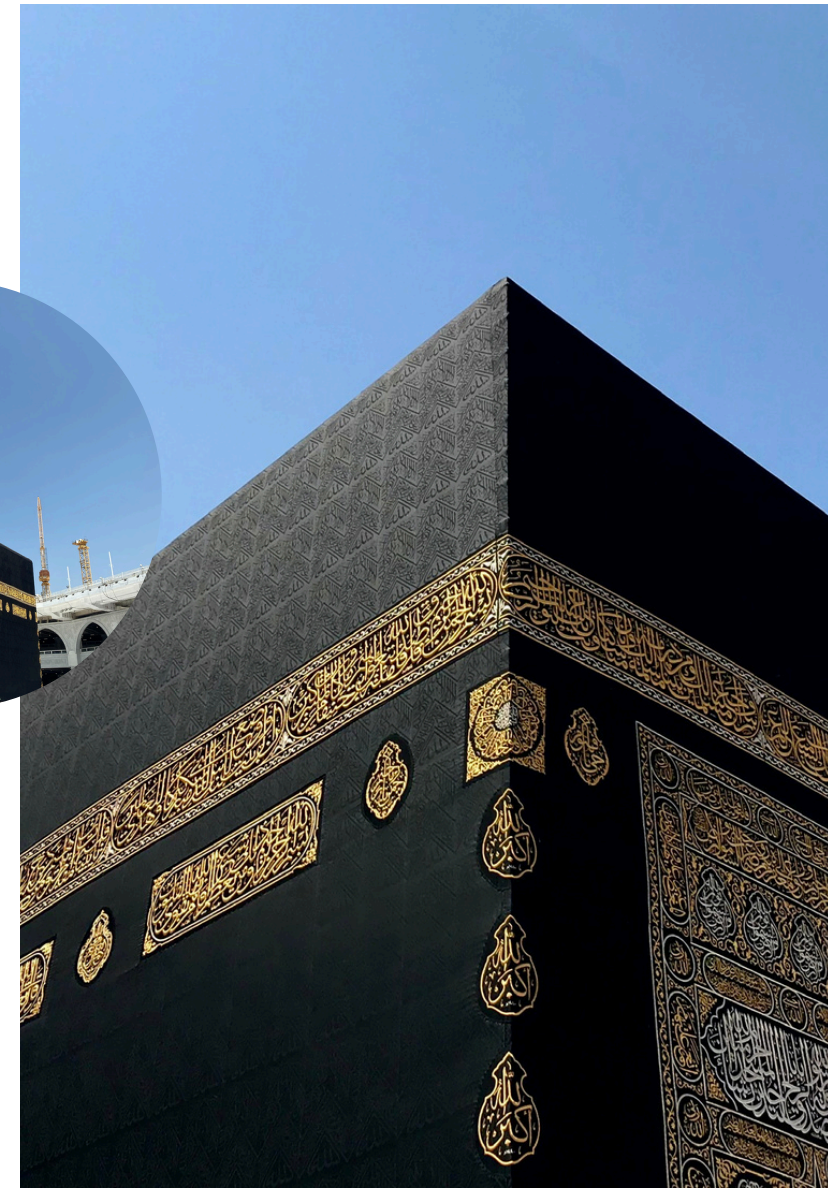
Power – 230V, Type G plugs

First Steps After Landing



Clear Immigration — keep eVisa PDF on your phone for eGate scan.



Airport to City

- Riyadh: A1 metro (15 SAR) reaches centre in 25 min.
- Jeddah: SAPTCO shuttle to Corniche (18 SAR).



SIM Card — STC “Visitor 20 GB” ≈60 SAR; buy before baggage claim.



Transport Card — Rechargeable Riyadh Pass covers metro, bus, BRT.



Must-have Apps — Careem, Moqalat (women-only taxis), VisitSaudi.



Cash Tip — ATMs plentiful, yet take 200 SAR small notes for street food.



Places You'll Tell Stories About



Riyadh & Diriyah

Bargain for oud at Souq Al-Zal, then wander mud-brick palaces in At-Turaif as lanterns glow.



Jeddah's Al-Balad

Coral-stone balconies lean over spice-filled alleys; nights drift on Red Sea breeze.



Al-Ula & Hegra

Nabataean tombs turn rose-gold at sunrise; trace constellations beyond city.



Asir Mountains

In Abha, clouds swirl round hillside homes. Ride the cable above terraced slopes.



The Empty Quarter

Sand waves taller than towers; silence thick enough to hear your heartbeat under the stars.



Al-Ahsa Oasis

Drift through a sea of date palms and wander the cool chambers of Jabal Qarah.

Culture & Taste

Coffee & Welcome — Hosts pour cardamom-spiced qahwa into tiny cups until you tilt yours to signal “enough.”



Kabsa

Saffron rice crowned with slow-cooked lamb.



Jareesh

Cracked-wheat porridge enriched with ghee.



Matazeez

Tender dough discs simmered in tomato-lamb gravy.

Etiquette in Brief

Hover among clown-fish; visibility reaches 30 m.

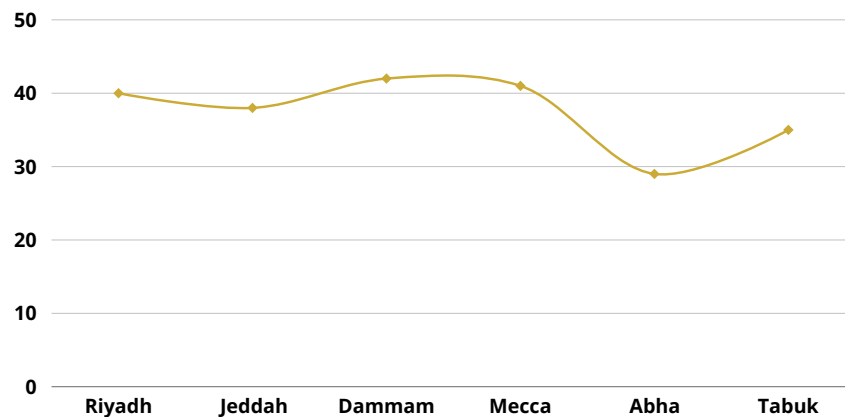
Twilight – Camel Racing at Janadriyah

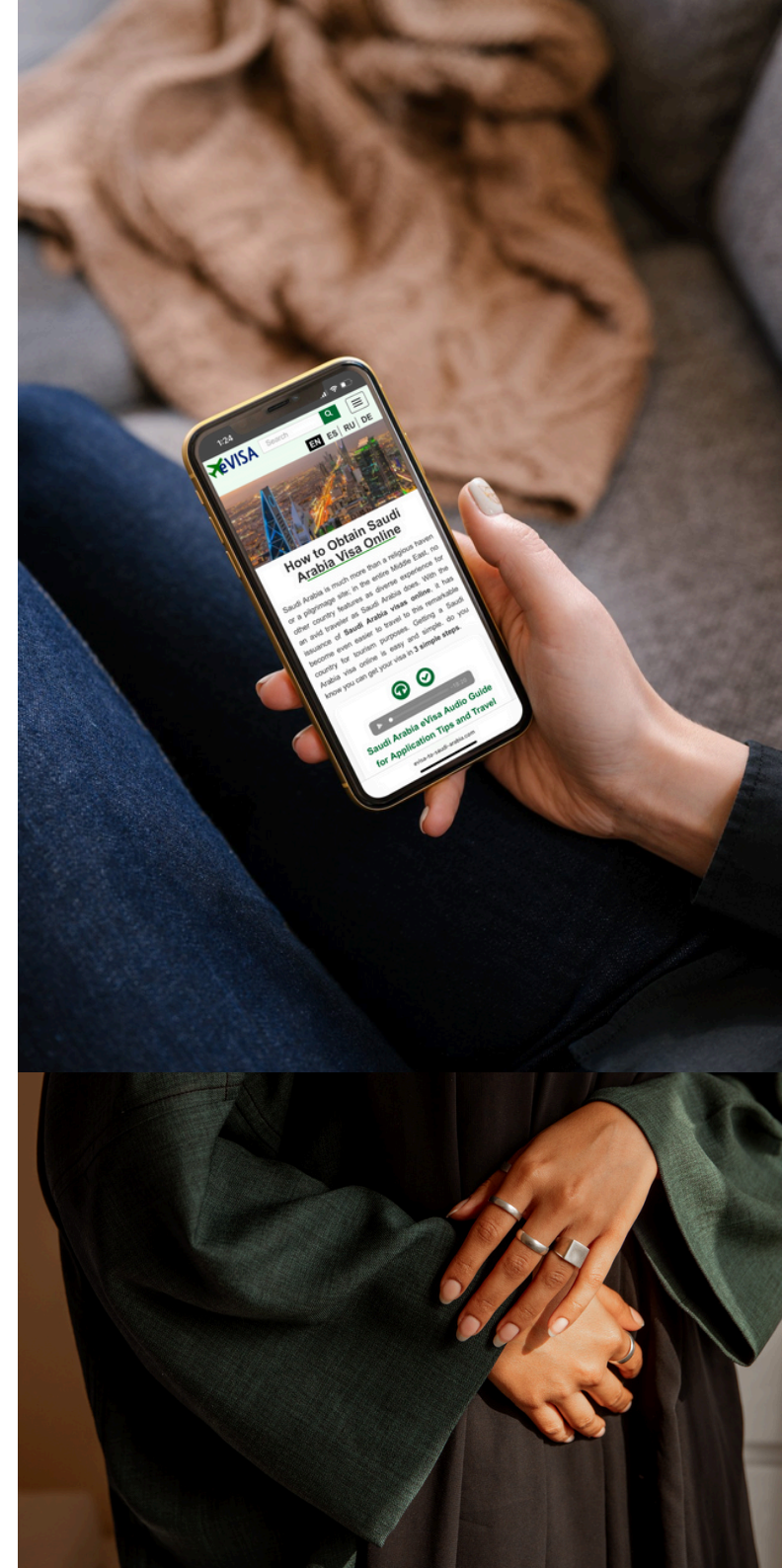
